Famed hotelier Ian Schrager has done it again, this time transforming Madison Avenue’s iconic clock tower into a chic, modernist haven. Built in 1909 as the headquarters for the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company, the distinguished landmark now boasts 273 rooms and suites with 12-foot ceilings and awe-inspiring views of the Manhattan skyline. On the second floor, original mahogany wainscoting provides the backdrop to the clubby social spaces that include The Clocktower restaurant, which is helmed by Michelin-starred chef Jason Atherton. Rates start at \$725.
